### 30TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF PRAN-PRATISHTHA SAVE THESE DATES SEPTEMBER 11, 12, 13, 2015

From the pages of history: Although ITA was formed in 1975, and a parcel of land was purchased in Lindenwold, it lacked the funds to construct a temple. It was Lord Krishna's divine grace that enabled our active members to merge and bring the assets of Shri Vallabhnidhi with ITA to purchase the existing property for our temple. On May 6, 1982 we purchased the church property and the Hindu Mandir in Berlin became a reality, a place of worship for all Hindus in the Delaware Valley.

Shri Narendra Amin was instrumental in providing the paintings for the temple beautification as well as the meticulous details associated with the ordering of the idols from India. On May 31, 1985, the Idols of Radha-Krishna arrived at the Mandir. However, because of in-transit damage to Radhaji's idol, the Pran-Pratishtha Mahotsava of Lord Krishna was performed on September 20, 21 and 22, 1985. Over the past 30 years, the temple and its services have grown along with the community. The thirtieth anniversary celebration gives us all an opportunity to remember, rejoice, and recommit ourselves to our beloved Mandir.

## First place winner - The Concept of God in Hinduism by Neil Menghani

Western scholars widely disagree over whether Hinduism should be considered a monotheistic or a polytheistic religion. Many of these scholars see Hindus worship and pray to the images of so many different “gods” and conclude immediately that Hinduism is polytheistic. Yet, the fact that all Hindus practice the religion differently complicates the issue. I believe that one can more accurately consider Hinduism to be a monotheistic religion because Hindu scripture and tradition emphasize the oneness of God and because the icons that Hindus worship are not gods themselves but rather represent different forms of the One.

Despite the common misconception that Hinduism has a seemingly infinite number of “gods,” religious texts can shed light on the true concept of God in Hinduism. While many Hindus choose to focus their attention on various different deities such as Vishnu, Hanuman, or Lakshmi, most of them would agree that these deities are all forms of the One. In fact, these individual deities can be seen as representing the diverse personalities or faces of God. As the Bhagavad-Gita states: “You are the original god / the primordial spirit of man, / the deepest treasure of all that is, / knower and what is to be known, / the supreme abode; / you pervade the universe / Lord of Boundless Form” (Chapter XI). This passage captures the idea that the spirit of God is so vast, allowing it to be present everywhere at once. Boiling the idea of “god” into simply the sum of all of the different deities would therefore be a misconception. God is much greater than the many human- and animal-like forms that Hindus worship in their everyday lives – the Divine presence is also a strong spiritual essence. According to Hindu tradition, the icon is one of the methods through which the Lord manifests itself, especially according to ideas of the Vaishnavas. Murtis, or icons, of specific Hindu gods make the idea of the Divine – which transcends all human scope of thought – more approachable, so that people can understand and feel its presence. Many Hindus take darshana – which literally means “seeing” but is sometimes translated as the “auspicious sight” – in order to connect with God. In doing so, they not only wish to “see” but also “to be seen” by these murtis. This exchange of vision with icons is consistent with the idea of a Brahman, or One, which is both transcendent and immanent.

The issue of whether Hinduism can be considered a monotheistic or polytheistic religion is a complicated one – it of course cannot be fully addressed in a single essay. The concept of Brahman is extremely abstract, one that shows up in texts as old as the Upanishads and one which many theologians struggle with. We therefore should not be too quick to assign a label to the religion or make hasty assumptions about the “concept of God.” After all, some Hindus may see murtis as the numerous faces of the One while others may practice the religion quite differently. When it comes to deciding between the two labels, however, monotheism represents a more accurate explanation of how Hindus perceive the Supreme Being.
